3.	In 1750, Jacob Huber began a cast iron furnace operation near this town. Record the fifth letter of the town.	
4.	How many different species of wood were used to construct the 50,000 piece parquet clock? Convert the number into a letter.	
5.	The 1797 Lichtenthaeler House at 34 Main Street produced wagons and later became a winery. How many children did the family have? Convert the number into a letter.	
6.	This first lady has a sequin fan is on display. Record the second letter of her first name.	
7.	In 1778, the Brethren's House served as a military hospital during the Revolutionary War. Typhus ravaged the facility killing at least 120 men. In what year was the Brethren's House build? Convert the fourth digit to a letter.	
8.	In August 1978, Mohammad Ali can to Lititz to introduce this Wilbur Chocolate candy to the world. Record the second letter of the candy bar's name.	
9.	This Physician-General compiled "The Lititz Pharmacopoeia" in 1778. It was the first American Formulary and a pioneer effort at the standardization of drug formulas. Record the third letter of his last name.
